DIFFERENT TYPES OF TENNIS ACTIVITIES



King/Queen Of The Court:

- Players line up to challenge the "king" or "queen" on one side of the court.
- The challenger plays a point against the king/queen, and if they win, they become the new king/queen.
- If the king/queen wins, they stay and face the next challenger.

Around the World:

- Players form a circle around the court and take turns hitting the ball.
- After hitting the ball, each player runs to the end of the line on the other side.
- If a player misses or hits out, they are out until the game resets.

Mini Tennis:

- Played on a smaller court or within the service boxes.
- Great for practicing control and precision.
- Can be played with regular scoring or with specific mini-tennis rules.

21:

- Players rally to score points with the goal of reaching 21.
- Points are won by making challenging shots that the opponent cannot return.
- Players can only score points on their serve, similar to volleyball.

Tennis Baseball:

- Adapt tennis to a baseball-like game with bases and innings.
- Players hit the ball and run to bases while fielders try to catch and return the ball to the pitcher.

One-Point Tournament:

- Players compete in a tournament where each match is decided by a single point.
- Fast-paced and exciting, with quick eliminations and plenty of chances for upsets.

Drop and Hit:

- Players start each point by dropping the ball and hitting it on the bounce.
- Helps practice quick reaction times and accuracy.

Continuous Rally:

- Players work together to keep the ball in play as long as possible.
- Count the number of consecutive shots to set and break records.
- Focus is on cooperation and consistency rather than competition.

Target Practice:

- Set up targets on the court for players to aim at.
- Points are awarded for hitting the targets, with different values for different targets.

Jailbreak:

- Players rally to score points with the goal of reaching 21.
- If a player misses a shot, they go to "jail" (a designated area).
- Teammates can free jailed players by hitting successful shots or completing challenges.
